2009 KEYNOTE SPEAKER: PAUL RUSESABAGINA



The American Model United Nations Conference is pleased to welcome the keynote speaker for our 20th Anniversary Conference, Mr. Paul Rusesabagina, the inspiration for the film *Hotel Rwanda*. His keynote address is on Sunday, 22 November, from 1:15-2:15 p.m.

Paul Rusesabagina is the real-life hero of the acclaimed film *Hotel Rwanda* and the President and Founder of the Hotel Rwanda Rusesabagina Foundation (www.hrrfoundation.org). As portrayed by actor Don Cheadle in the film, Rusesabagina saved the lives of more than 1,200 people during the 1994 Rwandan genocide. He served as manager of the Hotel des Mille Collines in Kigali, Rwanda. There he

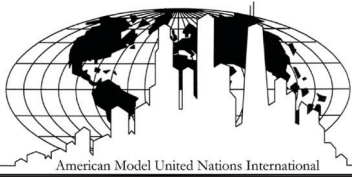
bravely risked his life to shelter Hutus and Tutsis who were seeking refuge from the genocide that killed more than 800,000 people.

After several years of speaking to the public about his experiences and the ongoing situation in Rwanda, Rusesabagina founded the HRRF. The foundation's goal is to help provide a voice to victims of genocide and support peace efforts in Rwanda and throughout the world. What started as a personal mission to teach the lessons of Rwanda has become an international movement to fight genocide throughout the world. Rusesabagina and the HRRF work to raise public awareness about the need for an internationally administered Truth and Reconciliation Commission for Rwanda and the Great Lakes Region of Africa. The Foundation also works on issues related to the ongoing conflict in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, where more than five million have died. It is campaigning for an end to Rwandan military intervention in the Congo and against the deadly exploitation of conflict minerals in the region.

Mr. Rusesabagina will also be signing copies of his autobiography, *An Ordinary Man*, which will be available after his speech. Representatives of the HRRF will also be available at Monday's Graduate School and Career Expo to provide more information to any AMUN participants who would like to get involved with the work of the foundation on your campus or as a volunteer.

AMUN DELEGATION LOTTERY

A lottery for country assignments for the 2010 AMUN Conference will be held on Monday, 23 November 2009.

Lottery applications are due to the Executive Office on the 4th floor, Room J before 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, 22 November 2009. A non-refundable \$50 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2010 fees. All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for first choice of country assignments. Schools that register for more than one delegation will be placed in the initial lottery for one delegation, and will be assigned additional delegations in subsequent lottery rounds.



Fee discount for all lottery participants!

Any school that registers through the lottery will receive a \$5.00 PER DELEGATE DISCOUNT on all delegate fees for the 2010 AMUN Conference. Thus if you bring 5 students or 50, AMUN will take \$5.00 off the regular per-delegate fees for each delegate attending. Even if you add additional delegations at a later date, the \$5/delegate discount will still apply.

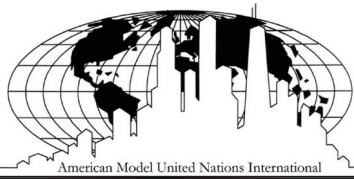
SAFETY AT AMUN

AMUN places extreme importance on the safety of our participants and guests. We hope that you have an excellent and fun learning experience while at the Conference, but encourage everyone to consider safety issues in and around the Conference hotel.
