SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Annual Ministerial Review: Implementing the Internationally Agreed Goals and Commitments in Regard to Global Public Health

The Economic and Social Council,

1 *Recognizing* the importance of the Millennium Development Goals,

2

3 *Emphasizing* the first and sixth Millennium Development Goals that urges
4 countries to eradicate extreme poverty and hunger and combat HIV/AIDS and other
5 diseases,

7 *Understanding* the severity and urgency of extreme poverty and hunger as well as
8 the urgent need of medical care for those who suffer from HIV/AIDS and other diseases,

9

10 *Fully believing* that with the help of crucial non-governmental organizations
11 (NGOs) and the International Community, the Economic and Social Council can meet the
12 emerging health care difficulties,

13

14 *Confident* that with proper funding the Economic and Social Council can obtain
15 the resources to achieve the goals in order to enhance global public health,

16

17 *Affirming* that education is required to reduce the problem of HIV/AIDS and other
18 diseases,

19

20 *Declaring* the importance of Member States and the international community to
21 promote long-term funding to developing countries,

22

23 1. *Calls upon* all Member States to fulfill their commitments of financial support
24 to development to aid in commitment to the goals previously stated;

26 2. *Requests* that NGOs and the Economic and Social Council to use collective
27 efforts to develop effective and efficient plans of action;

29 3. *Recommends* the establishment of clinics to aid people that suffer from

30 HIV/AIDS and other diseases which offer preventative care, access to medical personnel,
31 and pharmaceuticals;

33 4. *Encourages* Member States to call upon pharmaceutical companies to offer
34 necessary medication specifically to the countries most devastated by HIV/AIDS by
35 providing medication at cost, significant discount, or reduced cost through production of
36 generics, without reducing the wages of those who produce pharmaceutical;

38 5. *Calls upon* the United Nations to increase the eligibility for already existing
39 research grants of aforementioned pharmaceutical companies providing medication;

41 6. *Calls for* able Member States to provide funds for means of transportation to
42 access local clinics;

44 7. *Draws the attention to* collective efforts to create an agenda to collect resources
45 in order to provide food and shelter to citizens that have been displaced and currently face
46 extreme poverty and hunger;

48 8. *Encourages* research on economic, political, and social issues to determine the
49 underlying issues of HIV/AIDS and other diseases;

51 9. *Urges* the international community, NGOs and member states to collaborate
52 and respond to the difficulties the international community faces in regards to extreme
53 poverty and hunger and HIV/AIDS and other diseases in order to enhance global public
54 health;

56 10. *Further urges* the NGOs and the international community to assist in making
57 funds available to assist in tackling the challenges of poverty and hunger as well as
58 combating HIV/AIDS and other diseases.
