Recalling Article 2 Section 1 of the United Nations Charter, which recognizes
state sovereignty,
Welcoming the discussion raised through the completion of the Annual Ministerial
Review (AMR) in 2009 and relevant e-discussions,
Drawing attention to, in accordance with the AMR, the overall improvement in
reducing HIV/ AIDS, tuberculosis, and malaria, as it indicates progress in achieving
Millennium Development Goal (MDG) 6, yet the lack of progress of the fulfillment of
MDG 5 in improving maternal health,
Realizing that the amount of funding quailable for health age is limited due to the
<i>Realizing</i> that the amount of funding available for healthcare is limited due to the
current economic conditions,
Understanding that the reallocation of funds could possibly lead to a more
efficient outcome by allowing more people to receive medical aid,
1. Urges the United Nations to continue their current funding levels to Member
States in regards to health care programs;
2. Calls for cooperation between bodies on both the international and the national
level through:
(a) Partnerships for evaluative research of investment in existing healthcare
systems and programs by regional Non-governmental organizations (NGOs),
governments, the United Nations, and other international stake holders;
(b) Compiling recommendations that will serve as a framework for the
improvement of healthcare systems specific to these regions;
3. Further requests finances allocated to improving and expanding healthcare

30 systems by UN bodies to be carefully monitored in order to more efficiently move

31 towards the achievement of health related development goals, taking into account:

(a) Improvement of maternal and newborn healthcare through increased education
 and awareness of availability of services in these fields;

34 (b) Investment in retention of healthcare workers, encouraging them to remain in35 country; thereby increasing access for local healthcare professionals;

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4. *Encourages* sharing of health information between Member States through the
utilization of instruments such as the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) M-Health
Initiative, which utilizes mobile phones to provide health care data and information;

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5. *Recommends* dissemination of health literacy by utilization of instruments that
are applicable to the community, including, but not limited to, media, events, recognition
of international and national health days, and education by oral means;

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45 6. Urges Member States to improve the efficiency and transparency through
 46 completion of reports of the funding used by both national budget and external aid.
