29	1. Calls upon all Member S	tates of the United Nations to maintain support for the	

Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) and to increase monetary support as able and affirms that relief aid brings with it no future political or economic expectations;

2. *Recommends* that international aid for immediate response to natural disaster crises focuses primarily on the donation and transportation of non-monetary assets such as:

(a) Food aid and water assistance;

(b) Medical aid including supplies;

(c) Temporary infrastructure such as sandbags, tents, and temporary housing;

 (d) Transportation equipment;(e) Medical personnel and human resources;

3. *Endorses* regional Inter-Governmental organizations and Non-Governmental organizations (NGOs) as effective and efficient mechanisms to immediately address natural disaster crises especially through non-monetary assets;

4. Calls Upon all United Nations Member States to work within regional organizations such as the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), the European Union (EU), the African Union (AU), and the League of Arab States, as well as be prepared to provide non-monetary asset assistance as able to regional partners facing natural disasters;

5. Encourages the affected States, immediately following a natural disaster, to consult with relevant regional bodies in order to determine necessary response and supplies, as well as coordinate with NGOs and relevant United Nations organizations such as the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs;

6. *Urges* regional Inter-Governmental Organizations, upon receiving calls for aid from affected States, to quickly and efficiently provide appropriate relief measures;

7. *Recommends* that Member States cooperate with relevant NGOs such as the International Red Cross, the Red Crescent, and Doctors Without Borders in order to immediately provide humanitarian assistance;

8. Further recommends that NGOs supplement and serve as an alternative option for humanitarian assistance when regional organizations and bilateral aid are unable to fully address aid requests from affected States.
