The General Assembly

Affirming the actions of the United Nations in respect to Article 1.2 of the United 1 2 Nations Charter which states in partiality: "to develop friendly relations among nations 3 based on respect for the principle of equal rights and self-determination of peoples, and to 4 take other appropriate measures to strengthen universal peace", 5 6 *Convinced* that inter-Korean dialogue and cooperation are essential for 7 consolidating peace and security on the Korean peninsula and also contribute to peace 8 and stability in the region and beyond, in conformity with the purposes and principles of 9 the Charter, 10 11 Observing the limited positive effects that previous monetary and substantive aid 12 has had on the development of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, 13 14 *Guided by* the generally accepted political and economic theory that a globalized 15 economy in a Nation-State generally increases accountability and improves the overall standard-of-living, 16 17

Recognizing the previous political and economic cooperation undertaken by the
 Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Republic of Korea, particularly in respect
 to the Gaeseong-Pyongyang highway constructed in 2007 and the inter-Korean Kaesong
 industrial complex,

Further recognizing the prior success of the inter-Korean summit in 2000 in
 articulating points of cooperation between the Republic of Korea and the Democratic
 People's Republic of Korea, which was then subsequently affirmed by the General
 Assembly through A/RES/55/11,

Further affirming the General Assembly's resolution A/RES/62/5 which states in partiality to invite "Member states to continue to support and assist, as appropriate, the process of inter-Korean dialogue, reconciliation and reunification so that it may contribute to peace and security not only on the Korean peninsula but also in north-eastAsia and the world as a whole",

Noting with concern the actions of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea
 that have endangered the state of international peace, in particular their withdrawal in
 2009 from the Six-Party Talks and their recent violation of S/RES/1718,

1. *Calls upon* all Member States to recognize the respective sovereignties of the
 Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Republic of Korea in ultimately
 determining the most sustainable solution to creating a peaceful diplomatic agreement;

42 2. Urges the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and the Republic of Korea to
43 re-engage in bilateral diplomatic talks similar to the first inter-Korean summit in order to
44 draft a new peace agreement with the ultimate goal of ending the Korean War;

Further recommends the Democratic People's Republic of Korea to help
facilitate the building of domestic infrastructure, including but not limited to domestic
transport systems and health care;

4. *Stresses* the importance that the Democratic People's Republic of Korea return
to the Six Party Talks in an effort to fill their responsibilities as a sovereign State to
prevent further human rights violations;

54 5. *Requests* that the Democratic People's Republic of Korea re-enter the Nuclear
 55 Non-Proliferation Treaty as a sign of measurable progress towards a denuclearized
 56 Korean peninsula.
