1 2 3	Affirming Article 2, Section 1 of the United Nations Charter, which states that the UN is based upon the principles of sovereign equality,	
5 4 5 6 7	<i>Recognizing</i> that the concern about money laundering and the transfer of assets of illicit origin is a product of corruption, and stressing the need to address this concern consistent with the United Nations Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC),	
8 9 10	<i>Further recognizing</i> that fighting corruption at all levels is a priority and that corruption is a serious barrier to effective resource mobilization and allocation and diverts resources away from activities vital to the provision of public services,	
11 12 13 14	<i>Reaffirming</i> our commitment to the Stolen Assets Recovery Initiative (StARI), the United Nations Office on Drug and Crime (UNDOC), and the Financial Action Task Force (FATF),	
15 16 17 18	<i>Emphasizing</i> the need for all Member States to actively work to combat corrupt practices,	
19 20 21	<i>Urging</i> all Member States to widespread corruption in developing	continue their previous commitments to combat the states,
22 23 24	8	General Assembly Resolution 63/226 that affirms ransfer of illicit assets and corruption,
25 26 27	<i>Further recalling</i> the Paris D accountability and transparency for a	eclaration, which describes the need for mutual a strong international framework,
28	Noting with concern that the	StAR Initiative's mandate is set to expire by the end

31 32	<i>Concerned</i> that the Financial Action Task Force currently only meets once every five years, and believing that this is not sufficient to meet the complex challenges of the
33 34	corruption in global economy,
35 36	<i>Approving</i> the Monterey Consensus of the International Conference on Financing for Development, which underlined that fighting corruption at all levels is a priority,
37 38 39	<i>Desiring</i> more cooperation between all Member States to prevent and combat corrupt practices, while recognizing that there are regional differences that may hinder
40 41	said cooperation,
42 43	1. Takes note of the report of the Secretary-General;
44 45 46	2. <i>Calls upon</i> Member States and International Organizations to continues working to identify the best possible ways forward, principle among them being ways of fostering mutual trust, confidence, and strengthen cooperation;
47 48 49	3. <i>Condemns</i> corruption in all forms, including bribery, money laundering, and transfer of assets of illicit origin;
50 51 52	4. <i>Urges</i> Member States seeking to recover stolen assets to make full use, as needed, of the Star Initiative's efforts in providing assistance;
53 54 55	5. <i>Calls upon</i> Member State to financially support, in every way feasible and in accordance with their national sovereignty, the Stolen Asset Recovery Initiative;
56 57 58	6. <i>Welcomes</i> the anti-corruption efforts that have been taking place at all levels in the International Community;
59 60 61 62	7. <i>Encourages</i> all Member States to participate in information sharing, cooperation with Non-Governmental Organizations, and the implementation of technical best practices to improve information sharing;
63 64 65 66	8. <i>Endorses</i> cooperation among established regional organizations to combat corruption specific to said regions, while providing accountability to both within these established groups and the international community;
67 68 69	9. <i>Recommends</i> regional and international cooperation by holding annual conferences between nations to harmonize the criminal Legislation in an agreement upon
70 71	issues of criminalization;
72 73 74	10. <i>Recommends</i> that the World Bank, the UNODC, and the next Conference of States Parties on the United Nations Convention Against Corruption to renew and revise the constitution of the StAR Initiative, as necessary for the continuation of the progress

- 75 currently being made by the Initiative, before its expiration;
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11. *Recommends* that the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) meet annually, in

order to facilitate greater cooperation and increase the efficiency of assessing, evaluatingand initiating policy both in practice and in progress.
