1 2 3	Affirming Article 2.1 of the United Nations Charter which guarantees sovereign equality,
4 5	<i>Reaffirming</i> General Assembly resolutions 63/219, 62/194, and all other previous resolutions related to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD),
6 7 8	Also reaffirming General Assembly resolution 61/203 that declared 2010 the International Year of Biodiversity,
9 10 11	<i>Noting</i> the report of the Executive Secretary of the CBD on the work of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention,
12 13 14	<i>Welcoming</i> the work of the Rio Declaration on Environment and Development, especially in its effort to verify adherence to the CBD,
15 16 17	<i>Recalling</i> the success of the Microcredit Campaign and the goals set up by the official Development Assistance,
18 19 20	<i>Recognizing</i> that information sharing and exchange of knowledge can help Member States to internally develop technical competence for the protection of
21 22 23	biodiversity in areas under their jurisdiction, and further recognizing the positive role the TRIPS Agreement can play in this regard,
24 25 26	<i>Emphasizing</i> the need to simultaneously achieve environmental protection and economic development through the implementation of local action plans,
27 28	<i>Alarmed</i> with the affects of inaction among the developed and developing Member States and the current state of ecological degradation,
29 30 31	Realizing the benefits of conservation, protection, and sharing,

32	1. Encourages the participation of all Member States to the Convention on
33	Biological Diversity to strive to meet the 2010 goals of reducing the rate of loss of
34	biodiversity;

36	2. Calls upon Member States to develop a global partnership addressing
37	environmental issues impeding sustainable development for all communities of the world
38	and identifies a connection between a nation's well-being and its biological diversity - if a
39	nation is biologically stable, it will be more likely to be economically stable;

41	3. <i>Welcomes</i> action relevant to the Millennium Development Goals Seven and
42	Eight;

44	4. <i>Encourages</i> developed member States to facilitate access for developing
45	Member States to safe drinking water through technical resources;
46	5 December of ECOSOC develop a program that any work calleboratively with
47 48	5. <i>Recommends</i> ECOSOC develop a program that can work collaboratively with the International Monetary Fund and World Bank to provide Micro Loan assistance to
48 49	Member States wishing to carry out sustainable development practices;

51	6. Encourages international coordination and multilateral cooperation between
52	states concerning their national initiatives stemming from the Convention on Biological
53	Diversity's principles in establishing National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plans

57	genetic resources;

59	8. Further recognizes the recent progress made towards the the creation of an
60	international regime that would serve to facilitate the process of fair and equitable sharing
61	of the benefits arising from the use of genetic resources;

63	9. Recognizes that environmental degradation holds a strong relationship with
64	climate change and desertification.
