Situation in the Congo

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2. *Encourages* the Secretary General to fully utilize the contributions of African and non-aligned Member States in peacekeeping efforts, specifically in regions where Belgian troops have had a continued presence;

3. Calls on all United Nations Member States to restrict trade by ceasing any participation in the trade of small arms with Congo and other nations party to the conflict, to limit the resulting proliferation in the region;

- 4. *Invites* the warring parties to participate in a mediation session taking place in Liberia, moderated by the United Arab Republic;
- 5. Expresses its hope that national elections can be called in the interest of establishing a functional national government over the entirety of the Congolese territory, representing the will of the people;
- 6. Requests the assistance of the Economic and Social Council in stabilizing the Congo through economic and technological development;
 - 7. Calls upon states to stop shipment of arms to the Congo;
- 8. Strongly urges the government at Leopoldville to find and prosecute those responsible for the death of Prime Minister Lumumba:
- 9. Requests that Belgium and the Secretary-General investigate the role of Belgian citizens in the conflict and attempt to recall all Belgian nationals found to be participating in the conflict:
- 10. Condemns the ongoing presence of former Belgian military officers within the Katagan military;
- 11. *Urges* the willing abstention and disengagement of former Belgian military officers;
- 12. Reminds the government of Leopoldville that it has accepted responsibility for the safety of Prime Minister Lumumba and that the United Nations takes that responsibility very seriously.
