

Statement by the President of the Security Council

At the meeting of the Security Council, held on 23 November 2009, in connection with the Council's Consideration of the item entitled Word Usage in Resolution GEN 1/1/5, the President of the Security Council made the following statement on behalf of the Council:

- The Security Council commends the diligent work of the 1st Committee and the General Plenary. Concern has been raised regarding Resolution 1/1/5 that has been passed by the 1st Committee. This Resolution contains a clause, 2g, that gives rights through the United Nations. The Security Council expresses concern that this clause sets a precedent for controlling the rights of a nation, which is a violation of national sovereignty.

- The Security Council asks the General Plenary to amend resolution 1/1/5 in the combined session. The Council would like the word 'give' changed to 'reaffirm' to avoid interpreting this clause as a precedent for controlling the rights of a nation.
- The Security Council once again expresses its appreciation for the hard work of both committees and it does not intend to offend any nations involved. The Council's primary concern is the international right of sovereignty.
- 18 The Security Council hopes this situation will be resolved swiftly in a diplomatic manner.
