	<i>Recalling</i> the charter and mission of the United Nations to create and protect world peace,		
	<i>Recognizing</i> the imminent threat that terrorism poses to that peace in all its forms worldwide,		
	<i>Approving</i> the efforts of the international community in signing and ratifying of comprehensive anti-terrorism protocols,		
	<i>Keeping in mind</i> the potential success of working with other international organizations, such as the International Police (INTERPOL) and the Center for International Crime Prevention,		
	<i>Noting with satisfaction</i> the work being done by nations involved in capacity building programs and organizations working to enable all nations to implement the measures of the various counter-terrorism protocols,		
	<i>Noting with concern</i> that international terrorist organizations find support and financing through many different sources in different nations and prove difficult to engage directly,		
	<i>Observing</i> that many developing nations face difficulties in implementing the measures of the various counter-terrorism protocols due to a lack of monetary, technical, and other resources along with infrastructure and expertise,

- 32 3. *Calls upon* all nations to work together towards capacity building in developing
- 33 nations, with the understanding that capacity building:
- 34 a. Refers to the strengthening of a nation's human, scientific,
- 35 technological, organizational, institutional, and resource capabilities;
- 36 b. Helps to provide a nation with the ability to detect and prevent terrorist 37 attacks:
- 38 c. Also helps to dampen the ability to terrorist cells to function and
- 39 recruit within a nation;

- 41 4. *Recommends* that the United Nations Development Program Special Unit for Mutual
- 42 Development (UNDPSUMD) enables comprehensive civic education programs in
- 43 developing nations designed to increase understanding of methods and measures that can
- 44 be taken to combat terrorism domestically as well as internationally;
- 45
- 46 5. Encourages nations to take measures within their own borders as well as
- 47 internationally to combat the illicit financing of terrorism by strengthening their
- 48 commitments towards fighting illegal drug, narcotic, and weapons trade in addition to all
- 49 other forms of terror financing;

- 51 6. Encourages nations to move towards the criminalization of financing terrorist
- 52 organizations by any and all parties through institutional reforming and implementation
- 53 of law;

- 55 7. *Resolves* to remain actively seized of the matter.
