SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Technical Assistance for Implementing the International Conventions and Protocols Relating to Terrorism SUBMITTED TO: The Economic and Social Council SUBMITTED BY: Greece, Italy, Turkey, Egypt, Bangladesh, Congo, Germany, Portugal, Russian Federation, Slovakia The Economic and Social Council Affirming that all forms of terrorism are an infringement on human rights and disruption to civil society, Bearing in mind that terrorism should not be identified with specific religious and/or ethnic groups, Expecting the international community to stay true to the Global Counter Terrorism Strategy, which was adopted by all 192 member states on September 8, 2006 in combating acts of terror, Fully aware that not all member states have the resources or capacity to stop terrorist recruitment or to extradite terrorists. Convinced that technical assistance, information sharing, and training will reduce the threat of terrorism, 1. *Encourages* cooperation between nations on the Global Counter Terrorism Strategy, the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, and the 13 protocols and
