The Economic and Social Council

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Reaffirming all General Assembly and Security Council resolutions related to technical assistance in countering terrorism,

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Stressing again the need to strengthen international, regional and sub-regional cooperation to effectively prevent and combat terrorism, in particular by enhancing the national capacity of States through the provision of technical assistance,

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Recalling resolution 2009/21, in which it called upon member states, the United Nations, and other international, regional, and sub-regional organizations to step up their efforts to implement the strategy in an integrated manner and in all its aspects, including the increase in multilateral treaties and assistance between states.

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Fully aware of resolution 63/195 of 19 December 2008, in which it requested the UN Office on Drugs and Crime to enhance its technical assistance to Member States upon request to strengthen international cooperation in preventing and combating terrorism,

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Keeping in mind of the universal agreement by all member states of the unequivocal condemnation of terrorism in all its forms and manifestation, wherever and by whomsoever committed,

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1. *Endorses* the creation of a new initiative in counter-terrorism aid from developed countries to developing countries to be led by the Counter-Terrorism Executive Directorate and within the current framework of the Terrorism Prevention Branch;

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2. *Requests* the General Assembly and Security Council increase technical assistance in the area of counter-terrorism, with an increased focus on creating an infrastructure through increased aid to developing nations, that would allow peacekeepers to be used only in the case of host nation consent for counter-terrorism purposes;

29 30 3. *Encourages* host nations to allow peacekeeper presence in international conflicts involving terrorism;

4. Further invites Non-Governmental Organizations, (NGOs) and civil society to engage as appropriate, on how to enhance the efforts to implement the previously agreed upon UN Counter -Terrorism Strategy including through interaction with member states and the UN;

5. Reaffirms the importance of the further development and maintenance of fair and effective criminal justice systems in accordance with applicable international law as a fundamental basis of any strategy to counter terrorism, and requests the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNDC) whenever appropriate to realize its technical assistance program to counter terrorism with the elements necessary for building national capacity to strengthen criminal justice systems and the rule of law;

6. *Urges* member states that have not yet done so to consider becoming parties to existing international conventions and protocols related to terrorism;

7. Requests an executive summary by the Counter-Terrorism Executive Directorate, on progress of the implementation of technical assistance and suggestions for future methods of increasing efficiency;

8. *Encourages* the Executive Director to report on expenditure for terrorism prevention activities in the context of the consolidated budget for the biennium of 2010-2011 for the UNDC, at the reconvened twenty-first session of the Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice;

9. *Declares accordingly* the Secretary-General to submit to it at its sixty-sixth session a written report on the implementation of the ECOSOC resolutions regarding technical assistance
