1 *Noting with concern* the cultivation and refinement of narcotics being used to fund
2 terrorist activity,

3
4 *Guided by* the inherent differences between transnational and domestic terrorism,

5
6 *Bearing in mind* that economic despair creates the view of participation in terrorist
7 groups as a practical economic alternative,

8
9 *Desiring* to create viable economic alternatives to membership in terror
10 organizations,

11
12 *Fully aware that* political disenfranchisement and other human rights violations
13 promote the cycle of violence,

14
15 Deploing the association of terrorism and religion,

16
17 1. *Recommends* that the United Nation Development Program Special Unit for
18 Mutual Development (UNDPSUMD) take specific steps to provide sustainable
19 agricultural development assistance by:

20 (a.) Providing expertise, technical, and vocational support in sustainable crop
21 selection and irrigation solutions which create long term viability for individual
22 farmers;

23 (b.) Working to provide individuals, small businesses, and local cooperatives
24 access to global produce markets;

25
26 2. *Further recommends* the continuation of infrastructure building programs
27 aimed at providing basic social services such as food, water, education, and healthcare,
28 also:

29 (a.) Reminds member states that terrorist organizations often gain support by
30 providing such services when national and local governments fail to do so;

3. *Supports* nations who take independent initiatives to improve infrastructure which inherently reduce support for terrorists organizations;

4. *Endorses* intergovernmental organizations and nongovernmental organizations engaged in increasing awareness of human rights violations and their impact on terrorist recruitment and tactics;

5. *Further endorses* all organizations that strive to increase political awareness and activism amongst citizens in conflict regions by;

- (a.) Emphasizing interaction between states, regions, cultures, and continents through technology;
- (b.) Supporting efforts to increase access to technologies such the internet to isolated and conflict torn areas;

6. *Solemnly affirms* to remain seized of the matter.
