The Economic and Social Council

- 1 *Reaffirming* all General Assembly and Security Council resolutions related to
2 technical assistance in countering terrorism, including but not limited to Resolutions
3 E/2002/66, 60/288, 62/272, 63/195 and 64/177,
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5 *Affirming* the importance of national sovereignty, especially as it pertains to
6 proprietary intelligence information, specifically regarding technology and development,
7
8 *Noting the adoption of* preambular clause 3 of resolution 63/195, which states its
9 instigation of a 3 year strategy to enhance flexibility and effectiveness in providing policy
10 services and technical assistance,
11
12 *Observing* that many emerging nations may lack the capacity for an intelligence
13 network necessary to effectively combat terrorism,
14
15 1. *Encourages* the formation of multilateral and/or multiple bilateral technological
16 and developmental intelligence and information-sharing relationships as it applies to the
17 involved countries' needs, in order to further foster development;

19 2. *Further encourages* countries with emerging technological intelligence to enter
20 into the aforementioned multilateral and/or multiple bilateral technological intelligence-
21 sharing relationships;

23 3. *Requests* that, should a country feel the need to report information, regarding
24 national, regional, or technological acts of terror, it is under the discretion of the country
25 involved;
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27 4. *Supports* the pursuit of a more active technologically advanced anti-terrorism
28 department, and the Economic and Social Council actively seeks the participation of:
29 (a.) The international Civil Aviation Organization;

- 30 (b.) The International Maritime Organization;
31 (c.) The World Customs Organization which is essential;

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33 5. *Encourages* developing nations to expand upon and implement the information
34 received through intelligence-sharing relationships, regarding technology and
35 development for interested bodies the framework is instigated by:

- 36 (a.) International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL);
37 (b.) The Terrorism Prevention Branch of the United Nations Office on
38 Drugs and Crime;
39 (c.) The Counter-Terrorism Committee,
40 (d.) The International Criminal Court (ICC);
41 (e.) The Counter-Terrorism Implementation Task Force;

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43 6. *Approves* and urges developed countries to make use of the Mutual
44 Development Program to assist emerging countries in utilizing said information;

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46 7. *Resolves* to remain actively seized on the issue.
