## **Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia**

Sustainable Development and Productivity: Water

ESCWA/I/1

Resources The Economic and Social Commission for Western SUBMITTED TO: Asia SPONSORS: Jordan, Sudan The Economic and Social Council *Realizing* that access to water is a fundamental human right, Recognizing that water scarcity is a growing issue affecting member states of the Economic and Social Commission of Western Asia (ESCWA). Recalling the commitments outlined by the Convention on the Law of the Non-Navigational Uses of International Watercourses 1997, Deeply concerned about the negative effects damming has on the quality and availability of already scarce water resources to all watercourse states, 1. Encourages all member states of the ESCWA that have not already signed onto or ratified the Convention on the Law of the Non-Navigational Uses of International Watercourses 1997 to consider making further strides towards adoption; 2. Recommends multilateral dialogues among watercourse states to coordinate and share impact analysis' of future projects along the watercourse; 3. Further recommends states to implement early warning systems in order to recognize and prevent occurrence of drought, including: (a) Comprehensive network of geographic information systems; (b) Sharing of all climate data between ESCWA member states to better coordinate efforts: 4. *Urges* cooperation between states to facilitate communication with each other in times of crisis;

5. Encourages riparian states to consider alternative waste management procedures;

- 30 6. Urges states to consider multilateral trade agreements to compensate for negative
- 31 effects of upstream waterway developments to riparian states;
- 32 (a) Limit the pollution of water resources;
- 33 (b) To ensure consistency and water availability.
