1	Believing that it is every Member State's right to sovereignty,	
2 3 4 5 6	Recognizing that the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty's second pillar, primarily concerning disarmament, is, for many Member States, a threat to national sovereignty or some level,	
7 8 9	Fully aware of the roles of the First Committee, to assist in enabling and fulfilling the agreements of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT),	
10 11	Observing the failures and triumphs of the NPT in the past and present,	
12 13 14	Realizing that one of these failures is the ambiguity of Article X, which establishes a Member State's right to withdraw from the NPT after giving three-months notice,

- 4. *Affirms* that the increase in transparency of information would also provide another source of evidence for recourse through the Security Council;
- 5. *Further affirms* that the increase in transparency of information may very well lead to a decrease in false information surrounding the withdrawal of a Member State;
- 6. *Urges* others Member States to support this resolution to lead to clearer interpretations of withdrawals from the NPT.
