The General Assembly Second Committee,

<i>Recognizing</i> the need for protection of the environment for the preservation of future
generations,
Understanding that the actions of mankind have a direct impact on the global
environment,
Noting that all states are entitled to their respective sovereignty,
Affirming that a single economic policy is not a viable option in an international
community but that a global effort to spur growth is vital to international economic
success,
<i>Recalling</i> the body's sustained effort to reach the Millennium Development Goals,
1. Calls upon member states to continue current initiatives and increase investment for
the development of green infrastructure;
2. Encourages a system of foreign direct investment that will input capital into the
green technology economies:
(a) specifies that this system will have a consultative framework that will account
for variations in respective countries' economies;
(b) further specifies that the framework will focus on efficiency of green projects
to secure high returns on investment for developed countries investing in green
technologies;

3. Recommends that green technology initiatives be developed on a country-by-27 country basis to best serve each country's needs: 28 (a) initiatives may be developed by a consultative think tank encouraging national plans of action comprised of economic specialists, regional representatives, and 29 country representatives; 30 31 (b) member states shall remain the final arbiter in their negotiations and 32 implementation of the proposed initiatives; 33 (c) country representatives will work holistically with economic and regional 34 representatives to address a variety of initiatives and concerns that could include: (i) disaster relief and prevention technologies; 35 36 (ii) island preservation; 37 (iii) deforestation; 38 (iv) intellectual property rights; (v) solar initiatives; 39 40 (vi) water technologies ; (vii) environmental education; 41 (viii) civilian nuclear power technologies; 42 43 (ix) green reconstruction of war torn states; 44 (x) health Technologies; (xi) hydroelectric energy; 45 (xii) others to be added as needed. 46
