SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty

The General Assembly

- 1 *Bearing in mind* that Article IV of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty
2 (NPT), upheld at the 2010 review, concerning the safe pursuit and use of nuclear energy,
3
4 *Recognizing* that safe nuclear energy is vital for the development of many Member States,
5
6 *Noting* that all Member States have the right to obtain the technology and experience
7 needed to use nuclear energy for peaceful purposes, by virtue of international treaties and
8 Article IV of the NPT,
9
10 *Recognizing* that confidence is important for achieving security and peace,

12 *Emphasizing* the benefits of nuclear power including, but not limited to, energy security
13 in a time of rapidly depleting fossil fuels, sustainable development, and environmental
14 responsibility,
15
16 *Believing* that regional enrichment centers would lower the barriers for underdeveloped
17 and developing countries to create their own nuclear energy programs,
18
19 *1. Requests that the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) oversee the creation,*
20 *implementation, and maintenance of regional-level bodies that will:*
21 *(a) Train Member States in the following aspects:*
22 *(i) Security personnel;*
23 *(ii) Security systems;*
24 *(iii) Development of nuclear energy procedures;*
25 *(iv) Safe disposal of waste matter;*
26 *(b) Be neutral, composed of United Nations and IAEA officials and experts in*
27 *appropriate fields;*

29 *2. Urges* Member States to cooperate with these regional organizations so that safe, clean
30 nuclear energy can be obtained;

32 *3. Further requests* that the IAEA determine the location of the regional sectors that

- 33 would be under the purview of these bodies;

- 35 4. *Stresses* that, conforming to the principle of national sovereignty expressed in the
36 United Nations Charter Article II, any Member State not wishing to participate in this
37 program will in no way be required to do so;

- 39 5. *Encourages* the further exchange of nuclear technology between Nuclear Non-
40 Proliferation Treaty Member States to non-nuclear states, for peaceful purposes;

- 42 6. *Calls upon* the International Atomic Energy Agency to create a report on the feasibility
43 of the creation of regional enrichment centers to be submitted to the Secretary General in
44 2011;

- 46 7. *Further encourages* financial and/or technical assistance from nuclear states to non-
47 nuclear states, party to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty, to help develop nuclear
48 energy programs for peaceful purposes;

- 50 8. *Further calls upon* nations receiving nuclear technology to enact both the
51 comprehensive and additional protocols of the International Atomic Energy Agency
52 safeguards system;

- 54 9. *Invites* countries with experience in nuclear development to assist nuclear and non-
55 nuclear states in the creation and implementation of training, licensing, and inspection
56 programs for nuclear facilities and their continued responsible advancement.
