- 1    *Reaffirming* its resolution 812 (1993),  
2  
3            *Taking note* of the letters of the Permanent Representatives of Rwanda and  
4    Uganda of 22 February 1993, requesting the deployment of the United Nations observers  
5    along their common border,  
6  
7    *Acknowledging further* the report submitted by Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali, dated  
8    20 May 1993,  
9  
10    *Concerned* by the continuing violence in Rwanda and the threat that this violence poses  
11    to the economic development of the region,  
12  
13    *Stressing* the need to create a lasting, stable peace in Rwanda in order to preserve  
14    international peace and security,  
15  
16    *Applauding* the efforts of the Organization of African Unity and the Government of the  
17    United Republic of Tanzania in facilitating the Arusha peace talks,  
18  
19    *Expressing* hope that the negotiations in Arusha will prove fruitful,  
20  
21    1. *Decides* to establish the United Nations Observer Mission Uganda-Rwanda to be  
22    deployed on the Ugandan side of the border under the Organization of African Unity and  
23    the United Nations with the mandate of supporting the Organization of African Unity  
24    force currently monitoring the cease-fire and reporting on the situation;  
25  
26    2. *Decides* that United Nations Observer Mission Uganda-Rwanda will enforce the cease-  
27    fire and ensure that no military assistance crosses into Rwanda:  
28    a) The United Nations Observer Mission Uganda-Rwanda will be composed of 81  
29    military observers, 17 international and 7 local civilian support staff in compliance  
30    with the Interim Report of the Secretary-General on Rwanda;  
31    b) The military observers will be provided by member states at the request of he

- 32 Secretary-General;
- 33 c) These contributing countries will be selected following the local consultations
- 34 and with the convenience of the Security Council, being in mind the accepted
- 35 principle of equitable geographic location;
- 36 d) In addition to the military observers and the support staff, 500 protective forces
- 37 will be additionally deployed on the Ugandan side of the border, these protective
- 38 forces will be composed by the same means as the observational forces;
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- 40 3. *Requests* that the Secretary-General discuss with the Government of Uganda, before
- 41 the full deployment of United Nations Observer Mission Uganda-Rwanda, in order to
- 42 agree upon the safety and cooperation the Government of Uganda will ensure for United
- 43 Nations Observer Mission Uganda-Rwanda;
- 44
- 45 4. *Approves* the deployment of an advance party within twenty days of the adoption of
- 46 this resolution and the full deployment within thirty days of the arrival of the advance
- 47 party;
- 48
- 49 5. *Urges* the Government of Rwanda and the Rwandan Patriotic Front to respect the
- 50 cease-fire previously established, and to quickly come to a peace agreement;
- 51
- 52 6. *Requests* the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the status of the Arusha
- 53 peace talks, as well as any assistance the United Nations can provide to assist the
- 54 Organization for African Unity;
- 55
- 56 7. *Further requests* that the Secretary-General report to the Council on the
- 57 implementation of the present resolution within thirty days of the full deployment of
- 58 United Nations Observer Mission Uganda-Rwanda;
- 59
- 60 8. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter;
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- 62 9. *Additionally* decides to fund this operation from the General Fund.
