Reaffirming Security Council resolutions SC/4, SC/7, SC/9, SC/11, and all other relevant resolutions,
 Deeply concerned by the ongoing violence in Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
 Noting with regret that all Council initiatives to date have been less effective than hoped,
 Applauding the efforts of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization in this situation,
 Expressing regret at the losses that North Atlantic Treaty Organization troops have sustained, in particular the significant losses that French troops have sustained,

Recognizing the forceful resistance to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization troops near
 the airport of Neum,

Further recognizing that these United Kingdom troops are acting in conjunction with the
 United Nations Protective Force to restore peace and security in the Republic of Bosnia
 and Herzegovina in correspondence with resolutions SC/9 and SC/11,

19 Further reaffirming the belief that a negotiated political solution would provide for lasting peace within the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- 1. Condemns actions of Croat forces that oppose the aforementioned United
 Kingdom Forces in Neum;
- 2. Calls upon Member States to adhere to and recognize the importance of
 Presidential Statement 1 of 1 August 1993, and offer any and all available
 personnel to secure peace and security in the Republic of Bosnia and
 Herzegovina;

3. Further condemns forces in Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina who oppose the
 efforts of both the United Nations Protection Force as well as the efforts of the
 Atlantic Treaty Organization forces are in violation of Chapter VIII of the

- 34 United Nations Charter and threatens the goals of the previously adopted 35 resolutions; 36 37 4. Declares that if forces in opposition of the goals of the United Nations Security Council do not concede, the United Nations will be forced to respond with more severe action 38 39 on the matter. 40 5. Remains hopeful that forces in opposition of the United Nations in the Republic of 41 42 Bosnia and Herzegovina will allow for the possibility of a peaceful end to this to be reached through diplomatic avenues; 43
- 6. *Decides* to send a team of 5 United Nations negotiators to Bosnia in an effort to facilitate peace negotiations between all parties involved;
- 7. Decides further that this team will be accompanied by a party of 20 United Nations personnel reallocated form the United Nations Protection Force for their protection; 50
- 8. *Urges* the Commission for Peace in Bosnia to find a long-term peace plan with all
 expediency possible;
- 54 9. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
