41	3. Calls upon the current de facto government of Haiti to communicate with the United	
42	Nations Secretary General as well as President Aristide to reach a politically and mutually	
43	satisfying solution to alleviate the current political and humanitarian crisis:	
44	(a) <i>This</i> meeting shall take place at a location determined by the Secretary General	
45	upon communicating with the disputing parties;	
46	(b) <i>This</i> meeting shall be overseen by the Secretary General as well as members of	
47	the Security Council this body sees fit to oversee the proceedings;	
48	(c) If no agreement is reached between the legitimate and de facto governments,	
49	the embargo previously mentioned will go into effect on the date stated;	
50	(d) If the de facto government concedes and the President Aristide is returned as	
51	the rightful Head of State of the Republic of Haiti the embargo will cease;
