2 *The Historical Security Council,*

3

4 *Recalling* resolutions MRE/RES/1/91, MRE/RES/2/91, MRE/RES/3/92, adopted by the
5 Foreign Ministries of the Organization of American States,

6

7 *Noting in particular* resolutions 46/7 (1991), 46/138 (1991), 47/20A (1992), 47/143
8 (1992) adopted by the General Assembly,

9

10 *Reaffirming* its support of the Secretary-Generals of the United Nations and the
11 Organization of American States and of all other efforts of the international community to
12 reach a political solution to the urgent crisis in the Republic of Haiti,

13

14 *Recognizing* the need for an immediate, comprehensive, and peaceful settlement of this
15 crisis while still respecting the provisions of the Charter of United Nations as well as
16 international law,

17

18 *Deploing* the coup that ousted the rightfully elected President of the Republic of Haiti,
19 Jean-Bertrand Aristide,

20

21 *Condemning* the fact that President Aristide has not been reinstated as the
22 legitimate head of state of the Republic of Haiti,

23

24 *Acknowledging* that the development of this situation also contributes to an environment
25 of fear of persecution and economic dislocation that continues to increase the number of
26 Haitians seeking refuge in neighboring member states, particularly the United States of
27 America and the Dominican Republic,

28

29 *Further acknowledging* that the reversal of this trend is a necessity in preventing negative
30 impacts of refugees on the previously mentioned regions,

31

32 1. *Affirms* that a solution to the crisis in Haiti should reflect the previous resolutions of
33 both the Organization of American States and of the General Assembly of the United
34 Nations;

- 36 2. *Decides* to make the trade embargo recommended by the Organization of American
37 States mandatory and universal:
- 38 (a) If the legitimate government of Haiti is not restored the aforementioned
39 embargo will go into effect on 1 August 1993;
- 40
- 41 3. *Calls upon* the current de facto government of Haiti to communicate with the United
42 Nations Secretary General as well as President Aristide to reach a politically and mutually
43 satisfying solution to alleviate the current political and humanitarian crisis:
- 44 (a) *This* meeting shall take place at a location determined by the Secretary General
45 upon communicating with the disputing parties;
- 46 (b) *This* meeting shall be overseen by the Secretary General as well as members of
47 the Security Council this body sees fit to oversee the proceedings;
- 48 (c) *If* no agreement is reached between the legitimate and de facto governments,
49 the embargo previously mentioned will go into effect on the date stated;
- 50 (d) *If* the de facto government concedes and the President Aristide is returned as
51 the rightful Head of State of the Republic of Haiti the embargo will cease;

- 53 4. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
