Council in order to facilitate smoother operations;

5. *Requests further* that the Secretary-General continue to monitor the situation and report back to the Council;

43 6. *Urges* all Member States to contribute troops and other available resources as they are 44 able in order to reach full deployment as quickly as possible so as to foster peace and 45 stability in the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina;

- 7. *Decides* to expand the current mandate for the United Nations Protection Force to include:
- 49 (a) Peace enforcement capabilities in addition to peacekeeping;
- 50 (b) The establishment of provisional headquarters at the discretion of United
- 51 Nations Protection Force commanders;
- 52 (c)An additional 40,000 United Nations peace enforcement personnel
- 53 to be deployed to the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina
- 54 provided by Member States who recognize the severity of this
- 55 conflict in order to reach the 120,000 estimated by the Secretary-
- 56 General in conjunction with the 80,000 troops deployed by The
- 57 North Atlantic Treaty Organization;
