SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Bosnia

*The Historical Security Council,*

- 1 *Reaffirming* resolution SC/4, SC/7, and all other relevant resolutions,  
2  
3 *Further reaffirming* Presidential Statement 1,  
4  
5 *Deeply concerned* by the continued escalation of violence in Bosnia,  
6  
7 *Strongly condemning* the violence against United Nations peacekeeping forces as well as  
8 civilians within the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina,  
9  
10 *Recognizing* the current strategy of the United Nations is proving to be less effective than  
11 hoped,  
12  
13 *Further recognizing* that in hostile environments, peace enforcement acts as a way to  
14 ensure that conflicts involving the violation of the human rights of civilians as well as  
15 United Nations personnel are able to come to a swift and peaceful end,  
16  
17 *Acknowledging* that peace enforcement is a tool of modifying the behavior of aggressive  
18 parties who disregard the wishes of the international community and are a threat to  
19 international peace and security,  
20  
21 *Observing* that in order for the goals of the United Nations in the Republic of Bosnia and  
22 Herzegovina to be met and in response to the atrocities being committed in the region  
23 against civilians and United Nations' personnel an enforcement mechanism is required,  
24  
25 *Remaining hopeful* that a diplomatic solution may be found through dialogue,  
26  
27 *Acting* under Chapter 7 of the United Nations Charter,  
28  
29 1. *Demands* that all parties cease hostilities immediately;  
30  
31 2. *Reminds* all states of the multifaceted conflict in the Republic of Bosnia and  
32 Herzegovina and the violations of human rights that have resulted;

34 3. *Urges* all states recognize the need for peace enforcement practices in situations of  
35 large and extreme violations of human rights;

37 4. *Asks* that the North Atlantic Treaty Organization collaborate closely with the Security  
38 Council in order to facilitate smoother operations;

40 5. *Requests further* that the Secretary-General continue to monitor the situation and report  
41 back to the Council;

43 6. *Urges* all Member States to contribute troops and other available resources as they are  
44 able in order to reach full deployment as quickly as possible so as to foster peace and  
45 stability in the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina;

47 7. *Decides* to expand the current mandate for the United Nations Protection Force to  
48 include:

49 (a) Peace enforcement capabilities in addition to peacekeeping;

50 (b) The establishment of provisional headquarters at the discretion of United  
51 Nations Protection Force commanders;

52 (c) An additional 40,000 United Nations peace enforcement personnel  
53 to be deployed to the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina

54 provided by Member States who recognize the severity of this  
55 conflict in order to reach the 120,000 estimated by the Secretary-  
56 General in conjunction with the 80,000 troops deployed by The  
57 North Atlantic Treaty Organization;

59 8. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
