- 1            *Reaffirming* resolution 814 of 26 March 1993 (1993) and all other relevant  
2 resolutions,  
3  
4            *Further reaffirming* Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,  
5  
6            *Recognizing* the concerns expressed by the Secretary-General regarding the  
7 situation in Somalia,  
8  
9            *Approving* of the efforts of the third United Nations Coordination meeting for  
10 humanitarian assistance for Somalia,  
11  
12            *Commending* the United States for their efforts in the United Task Force and their  
13 progress toward restoring levels of peace and stability in Somalia,  
14  
15            *Noting with deep concern* the continuing reports of violence and instability in the  
16 region in addition to the failure of the rule of law,  
17  
18            *Expressing concern* for the failure of the arms embargo to prevent the import and  
19 transport of weapons into Somalia,  
20  
21            *Seeking* to effectively provide increased humanitarian assistance to the Somali  
22 civilian population without the impediments of widespread violence,  
23  
24            1. *Requests* that the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees in  
25 coordination with the Secretary-General to assist in the repatriation of refugees and  
26 internally displaced people and the resettlement of those populations;

28            2. *Condemns* the continued breaches of the cease-fire agreement that represent a  
29 blatant disregard of international law, and continue to pose a threat to international peace  
30 and security;

32 3. *Calls upon* all Somali parties to the dispute, including movements and factions,  
33 to comply fully with the commitments they have undertaken in the agreements they  
34 concluded at the informal preparatory meeting on Somali Political Reconciliation;

36 4. *Further calls upon* the Secretary-General to report on the status of the situation  
37 in Somalia;

39 5. *Encourages* the neutralization of radio broadcasting systems used to coordinate  
40 violent attacks in Somalia;

42 6. *Decides* to establish the United Nations Observer Mission to Somalia with the  
43 express mandate of observing the ports in Somalia as well as major border crossings to  
44 ensure the cessation of weapons trade;

45  
46 7. *Decides* to expand the mandate of the United Nations Operation in Somalia  
47 with a special focus on de-mining;

48  
49 8. *Decides*, in compliance with the recommendations of the Secretary-General, to  
50 supply an additional 8,000 military peacekeeping troops to the United Nations Operation  
51 in Somalia;

52  
53 9. *Decides* to deploy 750 troops from the expanded United Nations Operation in  
54 Somalia to fulfill the duties of the United Nations Observer Mission to Somalia until such  
55 a time that the Observer Mission can be fully deployed;

56  
57 10. *Urges* all Member States to support fully the efforts of the United Nations  
58 Operation in Somalia as well as the United Nations Observer Mission to Somalia with all  
59 urgency;

61 11. *Strongly urges* the continuation of dialogue among the disputing parties in  
62 conjunction with the Organization for African Unity and all other regional actors;

63  
64 12. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
