## AMUN - Delegation Lottery

AMUN will host a lottery for country assignments for the 2012 Conference on Monday, 21 November in Michigan A/B. All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for their choice of country assignments. After each participating school has been assigned one delegation in the first round, those schools that registered for more than one delegation will receive an additional assignment in a subsequent round, until all registration requests have been fulfilled.

Lottery applications are due to the Ohio Room on Sunday, 20 November before 10:00 p.m. A non-refundable \$50 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2012 fees.

In addition to receiving an early country selection, participating schools will also receive a \$5.00 per delegate discount for the 2012 AMUN Conference. Even if you add additional delegations at a later date, the \$5 discount per delegate will apply. 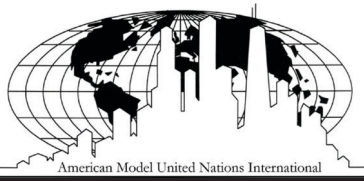

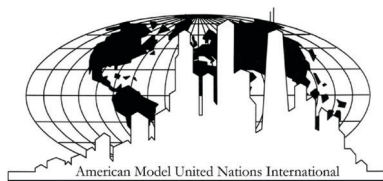

An immediate program to provide basic necessities for the poorest areas of the world—perhaps in the form of a global Marshall Plan—will be the first of many changes needed.

❖ He will turn our attention to the environment...

Pollution is the #1 killer in the world today, and new reports say the consequences of global warming will come sooner and be more catastrophic than expected if we fail to act in time.

❖ With his help we will see that all life is one...

Acting as one human family, we will rebuild our world along more just and compassionate lines, and thus create the only basis for lasting peace.

❖ His public work has already begun...

As millions worldwide take up his call for peace through sharing, he will acknowledge his role as World Teacher, the one awaited under different names by people of all religions and by those who simply wish for a better life for all—a Teacher for all humanity.

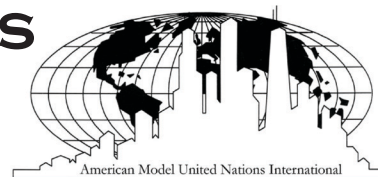

# SAFETY AT AMUN

AMUN places extreme importance on the safety of our participants and guests. We hope that you have an excellent and fun learning experience while at the Conference, but encourage everyone to consider safety issues in and around the Conference hotel. We also suggest that you follow several common sense rules to keep all participants safe during the conference. These include the following:

- As a general rule, do not leave the hotel grounds without letting your group know how to find you;
- Always let one of the leaders of your group (faculty, club officer, etc.) know where you are going prior to leaving the area around the hotel (to visit local friends or relatives, etc.);
- Never leave the hotel alone after dark; always travel with at least one person that you know;
- Always remove your name tag prior to leaving the hotel so as not to advertise yourself as a “tourist;”
- Help other participants to be safe by encouraging others to not travel outside of the hotel alone;
- Inform one of the leaders of your group immediately if you have a safety concern, or if any emergency situation occurs to you or another participant, regardless of the time;
- Remember that safety should always be more important than avoiding minor embarrassment to you or another person.

Please feel free to contact the AMUN staff at any time during the Conference, day or night, if any emergency or similar event occurs where we can be of assistance. **We can be reached in Ohio Room on Level 2 of the Sheraton Chicago Hotel and Towers, or find any Secretariat member wearing a blue badge.** If an emergency occurs that requires immediate help, you should also feel free to contact hotel security (dial 0 and ask the operator for “security”) for assistance.

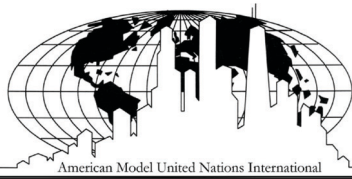
