SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Global Preparatory Meeting for Annual Ministerial Review (AMR) on Implementing the internationally agreed goals and commitments in regard to education

The Economic and Social Council

1 *Recognizing* education is a fundamental human right and a catalyst for achieving
2 other Millennium Development Goals,
3

4 *Acknowledging* the role of United Nations funding and programs as well as other
5 specialized agencies in promoting and implementing the internationally agreed upon
6 goals, such as the Millennium Development Goals and the Education for All goals under
7 the Dakar Framework for Action,
8

9 *Recalling* that the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the International
10 Covenant on Economic Social and Cultural Rights, and the Convention on the Rights of
11 the Child guarantee the right of every individual to education is recognized as inalienable
12 and free,
13

14 *Recognizing* that despite significant progress in realizing the Millennium
15 Development Goals, there is concern for the quality and sustainability of the global
16 education system, which will require capacity building at regional, national, and
17 international levels to achieve the goals in regard to education,
18

19 *Desiring* the accessibility of quality education for all groups of the population as
20 the base of social mobility and inequity,
21

22 Taking into consideration the economic and social mobility in professional
23 personnel created through continuous lifelong education,
24

25 *Encouraging* the creation of conditions for active involvement of children,
26 students of educational institutions into economic, social-political and cultural life of
27 society,
28

29 *Further* requests conditions for development and efficient usage of scientific,
30 technical research, and energizing innovative activity,

32 1. *Takes note* of the many reports of the Annual Ministerial Review (AMR) on the
33 international goals and commitments in regards to education;

2. *Reaffirms* that education for all is essential for achieving the goals of

(a) eradicating poverty;

(b) reducing child mortality;

(c) curbing population growth;

(d) achieving gender equality;

(e) encouraging sustainable development;

(f) fostering peace and democracy;

3. *Suggests* that all measures be taken to strengthen global human, scientific, technological, organizational, institutional, and resource capabilities by providing technical and financial assistance.
