1. Encourages international, private sector, and non-governmental organizations

to pursue investment in the Palestinian territories in order to provide capital with which to allow entrepreneurship and small business growth;

2. *Invites* the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank, and other international financial institutions to initiate microfinance opportunities for the citizens of the Palestinian Territories, which provide capital to start businesses promoting Palestinian economic prosperity;

3. *Encourages* that the international community works actively to increase education in the areas of vocational training, infrastructure development, and small business management;

4. *Recommends* that NGOs and United Nations organizations lead those initiatives within the Palestinian territories;

5. *Expresses hope* that Israel will grant and honor building permits which enable Palestinians to build infrastructure and increase employment opportunities;

6. Resolves to remain seized on this issue.
