SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Consolidation of peace through practical
disarmament measures

The General Assembly First Committee

1 *Recognizing* the proliferation of anti-personnel landmines in post-conflict
2 countries,

3
4 *Emphasizing* the indiscriminate and anonymous violence landmines cause to
5 civilians on a daily basis,

6
7 *Bearing in mind* the need for the international community to fully recognize the
8 problematic nature of landmines and need for cooperation in both de-mining and ceasing
9 future use of landmines,

10
11 *Noting with deep concern* that debilitating societal effects of landmines, including
12 preventing access to medical facilities, clean water, and schools for civilians, causing
13 structural problems, poses a permanent threat to international security.

15 1. *Affirms* existing international organs and treaties that deal with anti-personnel
16 landmines including the Ottawa Treaty, United Nations Office for Project Services, and
17 all other relevant institutions;

19 2. *Recommends* a survey and prioritization of countries where landmine violence
20 is most pervasive;

21
22 3. *Calls upon* Member States and relevant non-State actors to disseminate both
23 disarming technology and medical assistance, deferring to Economic and Social Council
24 for their funding, to countries affected by landmines including:

25 (a) Training of landmine removal personnel and education of communities on
26 landmine zones and safety precautions;

27 (b) Adequate psychological and physical treatment to landmine victims with
28 respect to their reintegration into society;

30 4. *Requests* that each State that manufactures landmines implement a tracing
31 program and a numerical tagging system for monitoring usage;

33 5. *Urges* the consideration of societal effects of landmines in future
34 comprehensive solutions;

36 6. *Discourages* the production and transport of landmines among Member States.
