Diplomatic Agents, of 1973;

2. *Calls upon* all Member States who have not ratified the Vienna Conventions to do so with all deliberate speed;

3. *Condemns* all acts of violence against diplomatic and consular missions and representatives;

4. *Encourages* the enhancement of security in places where the safety of diplomats or consular are at risk;

5. *Expresses its conviction* that non-state actors should be held accountable for diplomatic violations;

6. *Calls upon* the host state to ensure protection for diplomatic representatives while traveling within their host state,

7. *Emphasizes* the importance of diplomats to abide by laws of the state in which they are traveling;

8. *Welcomes* the role of the Secretary-General to receive reports of violations in the protection, security and safety of diplomatic and consular missions from sending and receiving States, pursuant to A/RES/65/30, in order to increase multilateral communication and collaboration between States;

9. *Proposes* that if a host country is incapable of providing appropriate security for its diplomats, the sending country will be responsible for protecting its ambassadors and providing further relief upon request of the state;

10. *Notes* that if there is an identified specific threat, appropriate actions should be taken by all means to provide protective security for diplomatic premises in the hosting state;

11. *Suggests* that Member States should work in accordance with established bodies upon the request of the high-risk environments.
