SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Global Initiative to Fight Human Trafficking

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Plenary

The General Assembly Plenary,

Bearing in mind Article 2 of the United Nations Charter, which emphasizes the importance of Member States' sovereignty,

Recognizing that human trafficking remains a global issue, which should be resolved before it becomes even more prolific,

Affirming that all forms of human trafficking are an infringement on human rights and a violation of a human being's dignity,

Reaffirming General Assembly resolution A/RES/64/293, the United Nations Global Plan of Action to Combat Trafficking in Persons, The Prevention and Suppression of Human Trafficking Act of 2011, and the work the Group of Friends United Against Human Trafficking,

Noting with special consideration the vulnerable strata of society such as women and children,

- 1. Reiterates the importance of previous work of the body in attempting to combat the trafficking in persons through global standards, regional bodies, and dialogue, regardless of being a source, transit, or destination country;
- 2. *Emphasizes* that all measures need to be taken to strengthen the security and resource capabilities of the Member States by providing the financial assistance, including special focus on all nations in dire need of assistance to combat human trafficking;
- *3. Encourages* the Member States to accept The Prevention and Suppression of Human Trafficking Act 2011 to make the trafficking of human beings a punishable criminal act;
- 4. Further encourages use of Public Service Announcements and Mass Media that is available to each Member State, including, but not limited to, television, radio, newsprint, and social media, to raise awareness of human trafficking especially among the public;
 - 5. *Notes* that some children are unaccountable due to the lack of a birth certificate

and therefore, stresses the importance of a registration that includes:
(a) Better identification of every individual beginning at birth;
(b) Official documentation regarding the location of residency.
