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## SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Sudan

SUBMITTED TO: The Security Council

The Security Council,

1 *Recognizing* the sovereignty of the Member States of Sudan and South Sudan under the UN Charter clause 1.2. 2 3 4 *Recalling* its resolutions and statements of its President concerning Sudan, such as the resolutions 1590 (2005), 1627 (2005), 1663 (2006), 1706 (2006), 1709 (2006), 1714 5 (2006), 1755 (2007), 1812 (2008), 1870 (2009), 1919 (2010), 1978 (2011), and 1997 6 7 (2011), 8 9 *Aware* of the peacekeeping troops are currently the United Nations Interim 10 Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA) and the United Nations Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS), 11 12 13 *Emphasizing* that 300,000 people have died and 3 million people have been displaced in the conflict in the region of Sudan, 14 15 16 Acknowledging that the fighting in the Sudanese region is historical and although 17 the civil war has ended with the creation of the state of South Sudan, frequent fighting is 18 still reported throughout the region, 19 20 *Deeply disturbed* by the increased conflict on the Sudanese and South Sudanese border, including the targeted bombing of specific areas, which is especially targeting the 21 22 non-military forces in refugee camps and non-governmental organizations and UN 23 humanitarian efforts, such as Amnesty International, United States Agency for International Development (USAID), World Food Organization, and International Red 24 25 Cross, 26 27 Alarmed at the Sudanese air strikes that killed twenty-two individuals in a South 28 Sudanese refugee camp on 22 November 2011, 29 30 *Further alarmed by* the current aggression between the two States which 31 developed this week, 32 33 1. Implores all parties involved, including Sudan and South Sudan, in the dispute 34 to cease fire immediately; 35 36 2. *Calls* for the establishment of a no-fly zone applying to all aircraft not approved 37 by the African Union and United Nations joint mission to deter further aerial attacks in 38 the border region, for the purpose of assisting present peacekeeping operations, with an 39 emphasis on protecting refugee camps which: a. Extend fifty miles in either direction along the border between Sudan and South 40 41 Sudan; 42 b. Requests that Member States acting in accordance with the African Union 43 mission supply the necessary coordinated enforcement of the no-fly zone; c. Shall cease upon the discretion of the joint African Union and United Nations 44 45 mission, Sudan, and South Sudan; 46 47 3. *Further calls* for the implementation of United Nations peacekeeping troops in 48 the cities of Blue Nile, South Kordofan, and Abyei and on the border between Sudan and 49 South Sudan, under the direction of UNMISS and with the cooperation of UNISFA to promote security in the border regions and aforementioned cities; 50 51 4. *Supports* the deployment of security forces which would be voluntarily 52 53 provided by the African Union, as well as any Member State which would like to aid the 54 efforts, with the purpose of protecting refugee camps specifically in the border region and 55 the humanitarian non-governmental organizations operating on the border between the two states; 56 57 58 5. Suggests the governments of Sudan and South Sudan work with the United 59 Nations for the creation of economic safety zones; 60 61 6. *Welcomes* the creation of an international fund to aid the efforts of: 62 a. Non-governmental organizations requesting financial assistance for the 63 reconstruction of infrastructure in the border region between South Sudan and Sudan; b. The governmental work with the United Nations in the above stated economic 64 65 safety zones; 66 7. Encourages United Nations to expand humanitarian efforts to Sudanese and 67 68 South Sudanese refugees in Chad and Ethiopia.
