2012 KEYNOTE SPEAKER

HIS EXCELLENCY, IBRAHIM O. DABBASHI, LIBYAN AMBASSADOR & DEPUTY PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE TO THE UN

Ibrahim Dabbashi has long been a fixture at the United Nations, serving as a diplomat for Libya, both under the Muammar el-Qaddafi regime, and since his country's transition to democracy. His career began when he joined the Libyan Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1975. Since then he has held a variety of postings, culminating in his appointment to the Libyan Mission to the United Nations in September of 2007. He participated in the UN General Assembly first from 1979-1984 and then later from 2004-2010. He also served as President of the Security Council in March of 2009. He now serves as Deputy Permanent Representative of Libya to the United Nations in New York, a posting Dabbashi has held since January 2009. He has also participated in meetings of the Non-Aligned Movement, the African Union (1978-1980), the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (2010), and the Human Rights Council (2007).

Mr. Dabbashi came into international focus when he publicly broke with the regime of Colonel

Muammar el-Qaddafi immediately after public uprisings began in Libya. He stated that the Libyan Mission to the United Nations represented the people of Libya and not a specific regime. Concerned for the lives of the Libyan people, Dabbashi asked the UN to intervene and establish a no-fly zone over Libya to protect the Libyan people. Since the overthrow of el-Qaddafi, Ibrahim Dabbashi has continued to serve his country and works to provide a peaceful home for the Libyan People.



SHERATON CHICAGO HOTEL & TOWERS VENUE MAP








SHERATON CHICAGO HOTEL & TOWERS VENUE MAP
