SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Changing Age Structures of Populations and their Implications for Development

SUBMITTED TO: The Commission on Population and Development

The Commission on Population and Development,

1 *Emphasizing* community centers will create employment and facilitate the
2 demographic transition,

3
4 *Deeply concerned* with encouraging civic duty through community programs,

5
6 *Recognizing* that each member state has different financial abilities, which could
7 result in some states requiring long-term funding while others will be able to become self-
8 sustainable,

9
10 *Emphasizing* that a signature to this draft resolution does not imply full commitment
11 to all clauses rather;

12 (a) To support the clauses mentioned that pertains to countries in need,

13 (b) Commitment to the specific clauses that pertain to your country,

14
15 *Aware of* the fact that every individual deserves a proper education, which allows
16 them to contribute to their society in a constructive way through employment and
17 community involvement,

19 *Noting* that promoting the elderly as teachers will reduce unemployment in the
20 elderly population,

21
22 *Expecting* that the United Nations provide technical assistance, training and funding
23 to start community centers that provide youth training programs throughout the
24 community with ultimate goal of self-sustainability,

26 *1. Recommends* the creation of community centers as a method of easing the
27 demographic transition through education and job training;

29 *2. Recommends* increased cooperation through Non-Governmental Organizations for
30 the establishment of these community centers;

32 *3. Seeks* that these community centers focus on community development through
33 community education, sex education, vocational training, modern agricultural techniques,

35 providing a secure location for citizens (particularly youth), information technology and
36 job training for the elderly population to incorporate them into the workforce;

38 *4. Proposes* in order to create a self-sustained community center, to incorporate the
39 elderly population as facilitators of the community center;

41 *5. Recommends* enlisting volunteers from the community and qualified individuals
42 from the local community as teachers in the community centers;

44 *6. Suggests* collaborating with the elderly population as teachers, resources,
45 counselors, and students to promote the sustainability and impact of the community
46 center;

48 *7. Recommends* those who participated in the various programs of the community
49 centers return as future teachers fostering self-sustainability;

51 *8. Highly recommends* Member States to equally implement educative measures that
52 would inform citizens of the importance of these initiatives stated to ensure a more
53 collaborative effort amongst citizens with a goal with long lasting support and
54 sustainability.
