SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Recovering From The World Financial and
Economic Crisis: A Global Jobs Pact

SUBMITTED TO: The Economic and Social Council

The Economic and Social Council,

1 *Recalling* the Global Jobs Pact, the outcome document of the Conference on the
2 World Financial and Economic Crisis, the Monterrey Consensus of the International
3 Conference on Financing for Development, as well as resolution 63/303, endorsing the
4 Global Jobs Pact on the highest level,
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6 *Recognizing* the need to implement the steps outlined in the Global Jobs Pact,
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8 *Noting* that each state has its own diverse needs, skills, and resources,
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10 *Aware* that only some Member States can fully benefit from regional economic
11 and social cooperation,
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13 *Concerned* with the lack of implementation and employment generated currently
14 from the Global Jobs Pact and,
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16 *Deeply Aware* of the upcoming end to the Millennium Development Goals,
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18 *Further recognizing* the effort to create sustainable development after the
19 expiration of the Millennium Development Goals in 2015,
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21 1. *Affirms* that the issues facing each Member States' economies cannot be
22 generalized,
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24 2. *Requests* that Member States submit a formal report, which will be standardized
25 by the the Economic and Social Council, titled the Localized Economic Development
26 Report, as an early order of business, to outline job-creating interests with at least the
27 following sections:

28 (a) An overview of the Member States' perceived needs, as related to job-creating
29 activities, which may include, education, health, infrastructure, investment,
30 and resources;

31 (b) A detailed section that explores the main points of the Member States' job-
32 creating and economic goals and how the Member States would ensure
33 requested needs would help accomplish such goals;

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34 (c) A discussion of the Member States' social and economic conditions, with
35 consideration of the global, regional, and local environment;

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38 3. *Invites* Member States to voluntarily engage in resource exchange with the goal
39 of development of all states,

40 4. *Further Recommends* that resources and services include natural resources,
41 human capital, education technical training, and infrastructure development,

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43 5. *Supports* the existing regional subcommittees of the Economic and Social
44 Council, which include the Economic Commission for Africa, the Economic and Social
45 Commission for Asia and the Pacific, the Economic Commission for Europe, the
46 Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean, and the Economic and
47 Social Commission for Western Asia:

48 (a) To ensure transparency between all parties in the agreements stemming from
49 this policy;

50 (b) To evaluate feasibility externalities associated with the agreements stemming
51 from this policy;

52 (c) To validate the agreements, and provide a framework for countries to maintain
53 the confidence of agreement;

54 (d) To review the agreement on a basis agreed by the parties involved, and to
55 ensure the agreements are carried through to completion;

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57 6. *Requests* the creation of national economic development goals to the
58 preexisting subcommittees that are regionally based, or the Economic and Social Council,

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60 7. *Encourages* the regional subcommittees of the Economic and Social Council to
61 design goals for their Member States under the framework of the Global Jobs pact,

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63 8. *Affirms* that the Economic and Social Council body can design development
64 goals if the subcommittees fail to reach consensus on economic development goals;

65 (a) All goals created by these subcommittee will first have to be approved by the
66 main body of Economic and Social Council prior to implementation.

67 (b) This body will reformat these goals into standardized reports with a time
68 frame;

69 (c) Any Member State within the region in question can present their own
70 economic developmental goals to the according regional subcommittee for approval or
71 appeal directly to the Economic and Social Council body;

72 (d) All goal created by this means will be reviewed biannually.
