1 2 3	<i>Emphasizing</i> the United Nations' goals to establish and achieve global acceptance of an agreed upon international framework for nuclear security and support its application,
4 5	<i>Reaffirming</i> the current regulations put forth in the nuclear safety and security by the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA),
6 7 8	<i>Taking into consideration</i> the measures already in place under Security Council Resolution 1540,
9	
10 11 12	<i>Bearing in mind</i> the goals of the Nuclear Non Proliferation treaty and the International Convention for the Suppression of Acts of Nuclear Terrorism (ISCANT),
13	Concerned that nuclear materials, while in transit for peaceful purposes, might be
14	intercepted by non-state actors or states pursuing nuclear weapons programs
15 16	Stresses the importance of signing on the Non Proliferation Treaty (NPT) as stated in Resolution 1887,
17	Resolution 1887,
18	Fully recognizing the need to address the security of all nuclear materials, whether
19	used for peaceful or non-peaceful purposes,
20	
21 22	<i>Fully aware</i> of the successes South American and African states have had by agreeing to a nuclear-free weapon zone,

24	Recognizing that by eliminating nuclear weapons material, Member States reduce the
25	likelihood of terrorists being able to acquire weapons-grade material,

27 28	Acknowledging the importance of nuclear energy and its research for peaceful

30 31	<i>1. Commends</i> the individual Member States for their efforts to gradually denuclearize through their nuclear arms reduction treaties;
32 33	2. Recommends Member States who have not yet done so sign and ratify the NPT;

35	3. Trusts Member States to adhere to the guidelines agreed upon becoming parties to
36	the Non Proliferation Treaty and set forth by the IAEA;

40	a Timely and Reliable Manner, Illicit Small Arms and Light Weapons;

43	best practices to combat the illicit transfer of nuclear materials;

45	6. Calls upon Member States to reduce their stockpile by developing a plan for
46	gradual reduction by setting a self imposed timeline;

49	nuclear activity on a regional scale;
