SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION:	Agriculture development and food security

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Plenary

The General Assembly Plenary

Commending neutral developed nations which provide aid to other nations struggling with food insecurity,

Noting with concern that many victims of food insecurity are members of rural, agricultural communities who remain unidentified by their nation's government,

Acknowledging that the full bounties of the agricultural goods that are shipped to nations struggling with food security and food production do not reach actual victims of starvation and malnutrition, and the value of this aid is therefore wasted,

Confident that education on biodiversity and promotion of studies on agricultural development will eventually allow developing nations to wean themselves of the previously mentioned aid from developed, stable nations,

Convinced that the only means by which to begin educating these agriculturalists would be to first identify them,

Guided by resolution 52/2 and reinforcing the work since 2001 of the Ministerial Conference and their ideals in the DOHA Development Agenda (DDA),

1. *Draws attention* to the need for agricultural education to decrease the world's starving population:

(a) Comprehensive agricultural education and training to the less fortunate including women, children, and indigenous populations;

(b) Education based on the research done for specific nations to include; climate, terrain, soil, crop tests, land and water concentration and management, biodiversity, potential alternative crops;

 (c) Continued education and training for those countries that choose to move beyond subsistence agriculture to sustainable agriculture;

2. Further recommends that the United Nations:

(a) Designates funds for the research institutions, such as the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research (CGIAR), through International Fund for Agricultural Development, to research the specific situations of individual countries to

- obtain proper knowledge of healthy crops, and to give recommendations of food trade within a region, creating local co-ops, and to allow nations with complementary needs to trade crops and enhance the nutrition of all people, especially children;
- (b) Calls upon United Nations to execute a annual geological survey, that is monitored by the United Nations;
 - (c) Encourages the World Food Program to;
 - (i). Continue respond to the individual needs of countries facing food crises in times of emergency (for instance, natural disasters and civil war);
 - (ii). Take an active role in assisting each country to become more self reliant while preserving the unique culture it contains and each state and nations' sovereignty;
 - (iii). Assist countries in becoming less dependent on such aid and more selfreliant;
 - (d) Emphasizes research on land management and biodiversity;
- (e) Continue current aid by creating more domestic and/or regional hubs for food distribution, to efficiently allocate and distribute the resources;
- (f) Recommends creating multilateral agreements to facilitate cooperation 52 between countries and nations.
