SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Agriculture Development and Food Security

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Second Committee

The General Assembly Second Committee,

Reaffirming the statements of the Almaty Declaration and the Food and Agricultural Organization concerning the importance of food security and defining food security as the availability, access, use, and stability of a Member State's food supply,

Reaffirming the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in regards to the human right to a stable supply of food and the World Summit on Food Security in Rome from 16 November 2009 to November 18 2009,

 Welcoming the gains in productivity made by small-scale farms relative to large corporate or mono-crop farms and that allowing greater access to high-yield, climate specialized, self-reproducing seeds for small-scale farms would greater develop and accentuate their advantages in productivity,

Acknowledging that, though women comprise an average of over 40 percent of the agricultural labor force in developing countries, they lack real power in regards to legal access and ownership of land, and would benefit from the existence of micro-financed opportunities focused on managing the daily tasks of both food production,

Recognizing that closing the gender gap in agricultural development could help alleviate hunger for 150 million people, thus empowering the female population that is vital to the survival of families worldwide,

Further Recognizing that specialized seeds, whose use is restricted by monetary constraints under the current patent system for high-yield varieties and regionally-specific seed types, could assist food deficient States in increasing agricultural productivity and thus, decrease dependence on international food donations,

Realizing that patented seeds that are often designed to be unable to create their own offspring, called "terminator seeds," both hinder agricultural independence and sustainability as new seeds must be bought or donated from specific vendors each year,

1. *Urges* Member States, multinational organizations, and other international entities to readjust the disbursement of micro-finance loans to be directed at agriculture to benefit and allow access to the knowledge and funding for women and girls that are currently

35 restricted;

2. Promotes the expansion of access to existing agricultural advances to small-scale, rural farmers through the creation of generic high-yield and specialized seed varieties capable of self-reproduction, just as the availability of generic medicines has expanded access to the most modern medicinal resources available;

3. *Invites* Member States to cease any and all economic sanctions involving agriculture in order to increase food security.
