SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION:	The Human Right to Safe Drinking Water and Sanitation
SUBMITTED TO:	The Human Rights Council
The Human Rights Council,	
Acknowledging the importance of sustainable sources of safe purified drinking water worldwide,	
<i>Noting</i> the rapid increase in urban water-borne diseases in developing nations and the 3.4 million people who die yearly from water related disease,	
Considering that the Purple Pipe Policy (P3) has been used in developed nations to provide municipal facilities with water without reducing the water available for urban areas,	
Recognizing the success the P3 program has had in the United States and Europe,	
1. <i>Recommends</i> that the P3 be instituted in developing nations which have capacity and that the excess water synthesized be directed to in-need areas;	
2. Expresses its hope that developed nations will provide aid in the form of education, technology transfers, and expertise from relevant officials in waste water treatment;	
3. Recognizes the potential for improvement in the following areas, including but not limited to: (a) Secondary level treatment standardization (b) Pathogen testing methods (c) Recycling of micturition;	
4. <i>Hopes</i> that the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) will review and implement this policy with assistance from the Commission On Sustainable Development (CSD).
