1 2	Affirming Resolution I/I as passed by this body,
2 3 4	Alarmed by the South African occupation of the sovereign state of Namibia,
5 6	Emphasizing UN recognition of an independent Namibian state,
7 8 9	<i>Recognizing</i> that South Africa views external military presence as a threat to their nation,
10 11 12	<i>Realizing</i> the need for Cuban troops to withdraw above the 13 <sup>th</sup> parallel as per the New York Accords,
13	Deeply regretting the escalating conflict in Sub-Saharan Africa,
15 16 17	1. <i>Emphasizes</i> the sentiments expressed by the UN Security Council in the recent press conference regarding South Africa;
17 18 19 20	2. <i>Calls upon</i> all parties involved to continue to implement the framework outlined in the New York Accords;
20 21 22 23	3. <i>Demands</i> the immediate cessation of all troop movements by South Africa within the sovereign state of Namibia as verified by UN Observers;
23 24 25 26 27	4. <i>Further Demands</i> Cuban troops in Angola to retreat north of the 13 <sup>th</sup> parallel following the aforementioned cessation of South African troop movement as verified by the UNSC;
28 29 30 31	5. <i>Further demands</i> the recognition of the Namibian state by South Africa and the overseen withdrawal of South Africa from its positions in Namibia by UN observers immediately;
32 33	6. Urges all involved parties to halt their military escalation in the area;
34	7. Recommends that if the aforementioned parties do not uphold these terms, further
