The Historical Security Council – 1990,

Reaffirming its resolutions 35/6 of October 1980, 43/19 of November 1988, and 44/22 of November 1989,

Noting with concern that the self-determination of the Kampuchean people continues to be hindered by the lack of a capable government,

Encouraged by the willingness of all involved parties to meet with each other diplomatically in order to solve the Indochinese crisis,

Expressing its concern that the conflict in Kampuchea threatens the sovereignty of Thailand,

Affirming UN donor countries for their continued support of affected displaced peoples of the region,

Alarmed by the increased deployment of foreign forces on the borders of Kampuchea, serving as a catalyst for further human rights violations,

1. Appeals to all member nations to offer aid to Kampuchean refugees and assist them in repatriating at the earliest safe opportunity;

2. *Calls upon* the People's Republic of Kampuchea and the Coalition Government of Democratic Kampuchea to establish a unified government with all appropriate speed;

3. Urges Vietnamese forces to withdraw from Kampuchea with all haste;

4. *Encourages* the GA Third Committee, Social and Humanitarian, to consider the situation of human trafficking that has thrived due to the border conflicts as well as lack of security surrounding refugee camps;

5. *Establishes* a United Nations Security Council observer group in Kampuchea to oversee the establishment of a unified government, in accord with the wishes of both parties and to investigate the reports of foreign troops on Kampuchean soil, to ensure that all parties abide by their previous agreements.
