1 2 3	Noting with alarm the continued conflict in Syria and the increasing amount of civilian deaths,
4 5	Expressing regret over the failure of past ceasefire agreements,
6 7 8	Reiterating that the sovereignty of Syria is ultimately determined by the will of its citizens,
9	Recalling Security Council Resolutions 2042 and 2043,
10 11 12	Concerned by the targeting of UN vehicles from Syrian forces,
13 14 15	1. Condemns not only actions of the Assad Government against peaceful protestors, but also deplorable actions committed by opposition groups including torture, beating, and indiscriminate killing;
16 17 18	2. <i>Deplores</i> the use of indiscriminate shelling on population centers which has caused the death of innocent civilians;
19 20 21 22 23	3. Calls for an immediate ceasefire imposed upon both sides of the conflict and a return to the principles laid out in the Six Point Plan and in SC resolutions 2042 and 2043;
24 25 26	5. <i>Condemns</i> the seizure of territory in the cross-border buffer zone by rebel forces;
27 28 29	6. <i>Requests</i> the cessation of all fighting in these cross-border buffer zones in keeping with the bilateral agreements that established them;
30 31	7. <i>Decides</i> that, in keeping with the spirit and intent of the Kofi Annan Peace Plan, Syria begin an inclusive, democratic, Syrian-led, monitored political transition to
