SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Syria

The Security Council

Well aware of the increasing attacks on both the Assad government and the Syrian opposition through the use of aerial attacks and heavy weapons, resulting in an increasing number of causalities and relocated civilians within Syrian borders,

Reaffirming the right of the Security Council to recommend measures for the peaceful adjustment of any situation, regardless of origin, which it deems likely to impair the general welfare or friendly relations among nations as expressed in the United Nations Charter,

Noting that unacceptable human rights violations have also occurred under the supervision of the Syrian opposition and Assad government,

Also noting with grave concern that since the outbreak of hostilities, over 37,000 Syrians have been killed and roughly 1.5 million people have been displaced internally by the violence, and over 400,000 refugees have fled the country, placing an enormous burden upon Syria's neighbors,

Fully aware that continued violence and instability in Syria is directly related to military and religious extremism, which undermines efforts for a peaceful resolution and further destabilizes the region,

Recognizing the importance of forming a stable and secure central government in Syria through a peaceful solution to the crisis following the Six-Point Plan put forth by Kofi Annan and endorsed by the Security Council of the United Nations and accepted by the Syrian authorities, as well as the Morsi Plan put forth by the Arab League,

- 1. *Calls upon* all parties involved with the conflict of Syria to cease all armed violence on uninvolved civilians immediately in order to put an end to all human rights violations and in order to sustain human life, and to fully comply with their obligations under international human rights law, and call for the beginning of a peaceful independent solution in Syria through:
- (a) Providing humanitarian relief to affected Syrian civilians, whether in need of evacuation or assistance, by monetary means for 60 days following the ceasefire of the opposing parties;

- (b) Also providing essential medical necessities to affected Syrian civilians within 60 days of the ceasefire agreement;
- (c) Ensuring that non-governmental organizations will facilitate these relief funds and guarantee that they are equally distributed to the affected civilians for the sole purpose of increasing the quality of life through humanitarian aid;
- 2. Also calls upon opposition groups and Assad government to observe in all instances international human rights law, to reject any association with extremist or terrorist organizations, and to seek at all times a peaceful solution to the conflict in order to create an atmosphere conducive to aid in a Syrian-led political transition;
- 3. *Decides* the need of Assad government and opposition groups to comply with the Six-Point Plan as stated in Draft Resolution S/2012/538;
- 4. Affirming that the United Nations will remain committed to reaching a conducive environment in order to pursue a Syrian-led solution that must be confirmed by dialogue by the parties involved in the violence, that meets the legitimate independent aspirations of its people;
 - 5. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
