## The Economic and Social Council

1 2	Acknowledging the disparity in development even within individual regions,
2 3 4	Noting with concern the high prevalence of poverty across the globe,
5 6 7	<i>Noting with approval</i> the emphasis on sustainable development and cooperation put forth in E/RES/2012/9,
8 9 10	<i>Reaffirming</i> the need to protect state sovereignty while providing options for states wishing to reduce their own poverty levels,
10 11 12 13	<i>Deeply convinced</i> that sustainable development is necessary for a long term solution to poverty,
13 14 15	Seeking to holistically approach the issue of poverty on a regional basis,
16 17	Recognizing that many women world-wide do not have access to education,
18 19 20	Acknowledging that education and skills training are viable long-term goals that will increase the abilities of a state's workforce,
21 22 23	1. <i>Encourages</i> cooperation between developed and developing states through idea- sharing and technology-sharing forums in order to address regional development issues;
24 25 26 27 28	2. <i>Further Encourages</i> the Commission on Social Development to consider adding a yearly conference to discuss poverty issues, possible regional solutions, and possible international solutions to their activities in recognition of the International Day for the Eradication of Poverty;
29 30 31 32	3. <i>Expresses</i> its hope that private foreign investments will be used to help build industry and technology use in an equitable manner in developing states and receive return for their investment;
33 34 35	4. <i>Endorses</i> the use of incentives by Member States in order to encourage education and skills training for individuals of all ages;
36	5. Supports the use of incentives by Member States to increase education of women and

- 39 6. Requests that Member States consider providing an incentive for citizen entrepreneurs
- 40 who are educated abroad to return to, and participate in industry within their home state 41 to build a robust economy;

- 43 7. *Recommends* that Member States welcome representatives from Non-Government
- 44 Organizations that seek to provide educational opportunities to those in isolated rural
- 45 areas.
