International cooperation in the peaceful uses of

outer space

The General Assembly Plenary

Addressing the issues of an increase in both severity and number of natural disasters as a result of nuclear radiation as well as its impact on the environment.

Inviting the cooperation of any nation wishing to progress both the peaceful use of space as well as further research on the effect of radiation and nuclear research on Earth's environment.

Endorsing the United Nations Millennium Development Goals in regards to develop a global partnership for development,

Emphasizing the United Nations Office of Outer Space Affairs (UNOOSA) goal in maintaining coordination and cooperation with space agencies and intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations involved in space-related activities,

Taking note of the common interest of many nations in terms of establishing a regulatory and humanitarian approach while conducting operations and/or research in outer-space regardless of their economic, social or militaristic positions,

1. *Encourages* the construction and/or use of existing internationally accessible satellites to capture information on but not limited to thermography, abnormal weather patterns, radiation levels and so forth of environments highly impacted by radiation, natural disasters, and the recovery from these;

2. Emphasizes an agreement that said satellite shall only be used for scientific research for the betterment of humanity;

3. *Further Encourages* the participation of both the United Nations Scientific Committee on the Effects Atomic Radiation and the United Nations Committee of the Peaceful Uses of Outer-Space to be the central bodies in which this research is conducted;

4. *Requests* all participating nations that all information and research conducted will be available to the public for the betterment of all nations;

5. *Recommends* that there be a bi-annual summit held by the Committee for the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space where researchers may present their findings to the public,

thus giving ample time to conduct research while keeping all information relevant and updated;

6. *Expresses its hope* that this program may give our world a better understanding of the effects of nuclear radiation on the environment and prevent disasters.
