35 36	Deeply concerned with the situation facing children affected by natural disasters		

40 and sudden complex emergencies, 41 42 1. Invites all States to accede to relevant international human rights and 43 humanitarian instruments, and urges them to implement those to which they are parties 44 of: 45 46 2. Recommends that States parties to the convention promote wide dissemination 47 and awareness of relevant standards on the rights of the child and develop education and 48 training activities on the rights of the child as a measure to ensure the protection of 49 children affected by natural disasters and complex emergencies; 50 51 3. Urgently requests that appropriate measures be taken by Member States and 52 United Nations agencies, within the scope of their respective mandates: 53 (a) To ensure humanitarian access to children affected by natural disasters and 54 complex emergencies; 55 (b) To facilitate the extension of humanitarian assistance, including education; (c) To ensure the physical and psychological recovery and reintegration into 56 57 society of those affected; 58 59 4. Urges States and other parties subjected to complex emergencies to respect 60 international humanitarian laws, with respect to maintain State sovereignty; 61 62 5. Calls upon States and United Nations bodies and organizations to treat children 63 in situations affected by natural disasters or complex emergencies, including in-field 64 operations and targeted area-based programmes, to enhance coordination and cooperation throughout the United Nations systems and to ensure effective protection for children; 65 66 67 6. *Calls upon* the relevant United Nations' funds and programmes, the specialized agencies and other competent bodies to explore ways and means by which they can 68 contribute more effectively to the protection of children as result of natural disasters and 69 70 complex emergencies; 71 72 7. Calls upon Member States to withdraw the reservations from the Convention of 73 the Rights of the Child, and urges Member States to withdraw reservations in reference to 74 the Vienna Declaration and Programme of Action; 75 76 8. *Requests* all States to implement, on an urgent basis, measures to protect 77 children from all, resultant and lasting, harm of natural disasters and complex 78 emergencies; 79 80 9. Underlines the great importance of including measures, specifically an annual 81 report to the United Nations' governing body to ensure the respect for the rights of the 82 child are upheld; 83 84 10. Stresses the special vulnerability of households headed by children as a result 85 of natural disaster or complex emergency, and calls upon States and United Nations 86 bodies to give programme guidelines to ensure their protection and care;
