	<i>Solemnly declaring</i> a commitment to ensure the safety and security of internally displaced persons (IDPs) forced to relocate due to this conflict,	
	Noting with deep concern the tens of thousands of lives lost since 7 April 1994,	
	Bearing in mind the sensitive geopolitical nature of this issue,	
	1. <i>Confirms</i> the commitment to providing humanitarian aid to all internally displaced Rwandan peoples;	
	2. <i>Designates</i> a safe zone in the southeastern border cities of Nemba and Ngenda, both located over 60 kilometers away from Kigali and with close access to Lake Cyohaha Sud and Lake Rwenu;	
	3. <i>Emphasizes</i> the safe passage of humanitarian aid workers and necessary supplies into the safe zone through an extension from the Kirundo Airport in northeastern Burundi to the Nemba Airport;	
	4. <i>Calls upon</i> the Rwandan government armed forces in cooperation with UNAMIR observers to support the security of these safe zones through maintaining the peaceful movement of IDPs and humanitarian aid to these areas;
