SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Georgia

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council -- 1994

*The Historical Security Council -- 1994*

1           *Recalling* Resolution 858 of 24 August 1993 establishing the United Nations'  
2 Observer Mission in Georgia (UNOMIG), and Resolution 892 of 22 December 1993,

3  
4           *Expressing* its confidence in the correlation of the presence of UNOMIG  
5 Observers and the reduction of violence in Abkhazia, Republic of Georgia,

6  
7           *Desiring* that the conditions for refugees and internally displaced persons affected  
8 by the conflict in the Republic of Georgia improve;

9  
10          *Bearing in mind* the psychological and economic harms refugees and internally  
11 displaced persons face,

12  
13          *Convinced* that the effectiveness of UNOMIG's oversight of the conflict depends  
14 on all parties willing to abide by the ceasefire established on 27 July 1993,

15  
16          1. *Solemnly affirms* a reinstatement of UNOMIG, with all associated military  
17 Observers returning to their previous posts in the Republic of Georgia, effective until 1  
18 October 1994:

19           (a) to maintain contacts with both sides to the conflict and military contingents of  
20 the Russian Federation;

21           (b) to monitor the situation and report to headquarters, with particular reference to  
22 any developments relevant to the efforts of the United Nations to promote a  
23 comprehensive political settlement;

24  
25          2. *Endorses* the creation of three camps to alleviate the dire situation faced by  
26 displaced persons and refugees, one in the Georgian capital of Tbilisi, one in the  
27 Georgian port city of Poti, and one in the Abkhazian capital Sukhumi;

28  
29          3. *Reiterates* the demand in its resolution 876 (1993) that all the parties to the  
30 conflict in Abkhazia, Republic of Georgia, refrain from the use of force and from any  
31 violation of international humanitarian law;

33          4. *Emphasizes* the need for all parties involved to continue peace negotiations;

35          5. *Expresses its hope* that all parties involved are willing to take whatever action  
36 necessary to alleviate the suffering of refugees and internally displaced persons in

37 Abkhazia, Republic of Georgia;

39 6. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
