Statement by the President of the Security Council

At the meeting of the Security Council, held on 13 February 1994, in connection with the Council's Consideration of the item entitled The Situation in Bosnia and Herzegovina, the President of the Security Council made the following statement on behalf of the Council:

- 1 The Security Council expresses its deep and abiding concern over the continued
- 2 hostilities in the Republic of Bosnia and Herzegovina. In light of the recent tragedy
- 3 endured by inhabitants of Sarajevo in which scores of people were killed by the shelling
- 4 of an open market, the Security Council once again calls upon all parties involved to
- 5 cease hostilities immediately and adhere to the agreements into which they have entered.

- 7 The Security Council also expresses its serious concern that the Republic of Croatia may
- 8 have deployed elements of its national military into Bosnia. It definitively condemns any
- 9 such aggression against a member state of the United Nations as both a violation of the
- 10 Charter of the United Nations and all relevant Security Council resolutions and as a
- 11 violation of Bosnia's territorial sovereignty.

- 13 The Security Council calls upon all parties to this conflict to take immediate steps to
- 14 forestall any action that impedes or otherwise compromises the delivery of humanitarian
- 15 aid into areas affected by this bloody and enduring conflict and refrain from violating
- 16 human rights at all times. Finally, it calls upon all parties to implement an immediate
- 17 ceasefire and enter into negotiations for peace in the interest of international security.

- 19 The Security Council will remain seized of this matter.
