SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in the Central African Republic

The Security Council

1 *Recalling* its resolution 2121 (2013) and its Press Statements of 14 August 2013,
2 29 April 2013, 25 March 2013, 22 March 2013, 20 March 2013, 11 January 2013, 4
3 January 2013, 27 December 2012 and 19 December 2012,

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5 *Reaffirming* its strong commitment to the sovereignty, independence, territorial
6 integrity and unity of the Central African Republic,

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8 *Concerned* with the recent curfew in the Central African Republic which has
9 been implemented in an attempt to maintain their national stability,

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11 *Deeply* concerned about the violations of human rights that have taken place since
12 the initiation of hostilities in the Central African Republic,

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14 *Aware* of the volatile political situation in the Central African Republic
15 concerning the significant lack of police and military forces necessary to maintain public
16 order,

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18 *Noting further* the need to implement some form of humanitarian aid and
19 temporary civil defense initiative in order to protect the people of the Central African
20 Republic,

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22 *Declaring* the need to immediately support the advancement of medical Central
23 African Republic and the delivery of supplies to the people of the Central African
24 Republic,

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26 *Keeping in mind* that the current situation in the Central African Republic can be
27 defined as genocide according to Article 2 of the Convention on the Prevention and
28 Punishment of the Crime of Genocide,

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30 1. *Stresses* the importance of ensuring a secure environment for refugees and
31 internally displaced persons until such a time that they can return safely to their homes
32 and communities;

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34 2. *Requests* non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to provide medical supplies,
35 medical education, and medical personnel to directly serve the civilian population of the
36 Central African Republic, specifically through:

- 40 (a) The International Committee on the Red Cross;
41 (b) Doctors Without Borders;

- 43 3. *Recommends* the further funding and expansion of MISCA, specifically by:
44 (a) Allocating all-terrain vehicles, donated by the United States, to provide safe
45 transportation for personnel, food, and medical supplies;
46 (b) Suggesting an increase in the number of peacekeeping personnel by 6,000
47 people beyond the currently planned level of 3,600 peacekeepers estimated for 2014;
48 (c) Providing United Nations sponsored peacekeeping training through the United
49 Nations Department of Peacekeeping Operations, specifically in regards to protecting
50 humanitarian and medical supplies, for MISCA personnel;

- 52 4. *Welcomes* the pledge of financial support of 5 million (USD) from Australia
53 and 5 million (USD) from Luxembourg to establish the United Nations Mission
54 for the Verification of Human Rights in the Central African Republic (MINUCAR) whose
55 primary goals are:
56 (a) To ensure the protection of the human rights of citizens of the Central African
57 Republic in conflict by allocating personnel who are experts in human rights, legal
58 matters, and national affairs;
59 (b) To provide conflict free zones in which all peoples will be guaranteed their
60 civil liberties and safety by using existing peacekeeping operations;
61 (c) To supplement the African Union missions in the Central African Republic
62 aimed at achieving similar goals in relation to stability and security;
63 (d) To stabilize the logistical needs of humanitarian aid elements and therefore
64 ensure the safe and full delivery of all humanitarian assistance to Central African
65 Republic civilians;
66 (e) To work in conjunction with domestic and international NGOs to provide
67 services to the civilian population of the Central African Republic;
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- 69 5. *Further calls upon* all Member States to provide assistance according to their
70 capabilities by any means possible to United Nations Integrated Peace Building
71 Office in the Central African Republic (BINUCA).
